

Eco-Friendly Golf Courses Leading the Way

As the allure of golf continues to draw enthusiasts across the United States and Latin America, the conversation around sustainability within the sport is gaining traction. With the <u>National Golf Foundation</u> reporting a surge in new course openings in 2023, there's a growing imperative for these developments to embrace environmentally accountable practices. In light of Earth Day approaching on April 22, let's shine a spotlight on three eco-conscious golf courses setting the standard for green golfing.

Shell Bay Course (Shell Bay - Hallandale Beach, Florida)





Nestled amidst the serene backdrop of Hallandale Beach, <u>Shell Bay</u> features a 7,254-yard Championship Golf course. This private enclave showcases a purposeful integration with its natural surroundings. The construction team's innovative approach includes underground piping worth \$1.5 million, facilitating water balance and mitigation efforts. Moreover, a strategic berm aids in drainage and long-term maintenance, while over 4,000 new trees and 6,000 shrubs enrich the landscape. Notably, the on-site garden yields seasonal organic produce for the culinary offerings, complementing Executive Chef Julien Jouhannuad's commitment to local sourcing.

Loraloma Course (Loraloma at Thomas Ranch – Spicewood, Texas)





Set to debut in spring 2025, the <u>Loraloma</u> Course in Spicewood, Texas, exemplifies a harmonious coexistence with nature. Designed by renowned architect David McLay-Kidd, this 18-hole championship course spans 120 acres, prioritizing water conservation and efficiency. With features like rainwater collection and gray water recycling, Loraloma aims to reduce irrigation needs by 20-30% compared to conventional courses. Notably, a forward-thinking approach involves utilizing treated wastewater effluent for full irrigation, a strategy projected to save a staggering 182 million gallons of water annually upon completion.

El Camaleón Golf Course (Mayakoba – Riviera Maya, Mexico)



Tucked away in the scenic Riviera Maya, <u>El Camaleón Golf Course</u> at <u>Mayakoba</u> showcases sustainable excellence. Recently renovated in 2023, this 18-hole marvel, crafted by golf legend Greg Norman, holds the distinction of being Mexico's first Audubon International-certified course. Its environmental stewardship extends across various fronts, from meticulous vegetation management to soil enrichment practices. Noteworthy initiatives include minimizing chemical usage and engaging in community outreach efforts, such as donating essentials to local children's organizations, embodying a holistic approach to sustainability.

These eco-friendly golf courses serve as shining examples of how responsible stewardship can harmonize with recreational pursuits.
